# INFRASTRUCTURAL UPGRADATION

#### **Library Facility Up-gradation**

The Institute has a well-furnished Air-Conditioned Reading Rooms and a computerized library with internet connectivity on all the computers. The Library has a rich collection of 29998 books (including 2464 Book-Bank books) with 10890 titles covering various management and commerce subjects, computer science, education, and humanities.

• The library has added 1453 Books (409 Titles) during 2019-2020.

- The library has also subscribed to various renowned 3116 online journals from IEEE, Elsevier's Science Direct, and Springer Nature 3 and 1788 E-Books.
- The library is also an Institutional Member of the Developing Library Network (DELNET) since 2015. Thus Library has arranged for more than 50 rare books (i.e., out of print) of History on Loan from DELNET.
- The library has subscribed to 67 National & 16 International Printed Journals.
- It has also subscribed to 21 General & Technical Magazines and 15 Newspapers.
- Subject notes by subject teachers and previous year question papers are also accessible through Library's website.
- Apart from CAS, SDI and Document Delivery Service, Library and Book-Bank have the facility access NDL, NPTEL, Swayam and other useful E-Resources on 30 computers through internet-connected computer terminals (or through Wi-Fi).

#### **Computing Facilities and Teaching aids up-gradation(2019-2020):**

- The computing resources are distributed in Nine Computer Labs (257 computers for students) and 72 computers are available in Library (for staff and students), faculty staffrooms and administrative block. Network and backup power supply with online UPS & 125 KVA generator have been catered. All legal software as per syllabi is available. Internet connectivity is provided with a 25mbps leased line.
- 2. **Research Lab cum Financial Lab** established. 45 New Computer Core i5, Lab is equipped with tally, Financial modeling tools and other software required for research.
- Classroom teaching is now shifted to online education due to the ongoing COVID 19 pandemic. Microsoft Teams, Webcams, Wi-Fi Routers, WACOM-Digital Pen Tablet, Head Phones and Speakers have been successfully installed and used for teaching online.
- 4. The New Domain name (www.msijanakpuri.com) has been registered and the website is fully functional.

# QUALITY SUSTAINANCE w.r.t TEACHING PEDAGOGY

The Institute has a well-qualified, dedicated and experienced faculty. The most contemporary teaching methodologies at MSI provide ample opportunities for students to develop into all-round professionals by keeping abreast of the ever-changing technologies. traditional classroom teaching is supplemented by regular tests, tutorials, group discussions, extensive lab work, projects, seminars and industrial exposure through industry visits and summer training. The classroom atmosphere is synergetic with interactive and participative sessions. ## **Highlights: Teaching-Learning**

MSI has shifted its off-line teaching to an online platform due to COVID 19 pandemic. The faculty members use the following forum for delivering lectures, giving assignments, conducting quizzes, webinars, etc.

1. Google Classroom was used to post the relevant study material and also the assignments to the students regularly using the same app.

2. We made our-self available to the students either using Google Classroom or Microsoft Teams App/ Google meet at a designated time.

3. We recorded the lectures and posted them using the You-Tube channel or saved them on our Google Drive and share the link to the students. The link was shared using Whats App or Google Classroom.

4. We have now purchased Microsoft Teams App for online teaching and started delivering lectures in this session using this app.

5. For smoothly conducting online classes, MSI purchased the following digital equipment's: Webcams, Wi-Fi Routers, WACOM-Digital Pen Tablet, Head Phones, Speakers.






