### 1. WORKSHOP 1: MICRO TEACHING AND SIMULATED TEACHING WORKSHOP

The objectives of the workshop were:

1. To provide a theoretical orientation to micro teaching and simulated teaching.
2. To provide knowledge for developing lesson plans of micro teaching and simulated teaching.
3. To enhance the teaching skills of students through microteaching and simulated teaching.

Following activities were conducted during the workshop. On 15.7.19 Orientation was provided to students towards microteaching and simulated teaching. A workshop was organized on **16<sup>th</sup> July 2019** ,Friday for the B.Ed students of Sem-I 2019-21 batch ,It was on film viewing and the analyzing the themes ,the movie shown was **“Rough Book”** . The facilitators for the workshop were Dr.Rajesh Gill, Dr.Vanita Anand and Dr.Monika Singh.

Rough Book is a hard look at the education system in India. It is Directed by: - Anant Narayan Mahadevan and is Written by: - Sanjay Chouhan. Though Indian education system is one of the finest systems in the world, the lacunae in the system have created issues that are threatening to clog the channels of learning in contemporary India. The story revolves around the division among students based on their grade. It avoids melodrama. A teacher and her students’ rebel against the system.based on actual experiences of parents, teachers and students told through the eyes of a teacher, Santoshi Kumari, who rallies through a divorce with a corrupt senior Indian Revenue Service officer to become a teacher of Physics. Her pupils are in the D division- "D" sarcastically refers to Duffers in the school by students and teachers. How Santoshitackles a system to set her own terms for her students forms the bulk of a simply told,thought-provoking and urgent film. The rebellion of the teacher and her students are internalised to make a relevant and contemporary movie.



### **3. WORKSHOP :“A SIGNIFICANT EVENT OR EXPERIENCE IN LIFE” Dated: 20<sup>th</sup> August 2019**

A Workshop on Significant Life Experience was held on **20<sup>th</sup> August, 2019** for the **first year B.Ed. Students** (Batch 2019-21) by **Dr. Usha Rani Malik and Dr. Vipasha Rana**. This was the **first workshop** under the course( P-155) Understanding the self (B.Ed. 155). The workshop gave the students an opportunity to reflect on their life and identify with their significant life experiences. The Workshop consisted of different phases.

#### **Phase 1- Theoretical Orientation**

The students were made understand the meaning, importance of different experiences and types of Experiences. The students were taught about the reflection process which consists of three questions- what, so what and now what?

**Phase 2- Representing a significant life experience as timeline, mind-map, and pictorial poster through Chart. (Individual Activity)**

#### **4. WORKSHOP: MINDFULNESS IN THE CLASSROOM Dated: 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2019**

Workshop on **Mindfulness in The Classroom** was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2019 in department of education.

##### **OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOP:**

- Mindfulness through the day, in classroom, in stressful contexts.
- Decrease anxiety, depression, irritability and moodiness.
- Increase emotional stability in students.
- Improved learning ability and memory.
- Increase ability to effectively manage problems.
- Improve perspective towards everything and better self-esteem.

##### **LEARNING EXPERIENCES:**

Mindfulness is about learning to train your attention to the present moment without dwelling on what has happened in the past or worrying about the future. Mindfulness provides many physical and psychological benefits.

In mindfulness meditation you learn to remain aware of what is happening and what you're feeling in that moment, whether you like it, dislike it, or are confused about it. You increase your tolerance for seeing the unpleasant - neither identifying with it, nor running from it. As you become more and more familiar with the usual patterns in your mind, mindfulness allows you to choose what your mind focuses on by interrupting its habits. For all this we can help students by teaching various types of yoga asanas which will keep their mind fresh and free from all the stress.

Meditation is a practice where an individual operates or trains the mind or induces a mode of consciousness, either to realize some benefit or for the mind to simply acknowledge its content without becoming identified with that content, or as an end in it.

##### **Various Types Yoga Asanas:**

- **Kapalbhati Yoga Asana:** Kapalbhathi pranayama is the most recommended breathing yoga exercise which cures our stomach disorder completely and loses weight. Practicing 5 minutes kapalbhathi pranayama regularly removes the toxins and increases metabolism. It also cures constipation, acidity, diabetes, Asthma and all kinds of Respiratory troubles, sinus and even hair loss. It is very effective in weight loss (mainly belly fats). This is superb yogasana for ever.

- **Baddha Konasana Yoga (Bound Angle Pose):** This pose of yoga for beginners helps to open up the hips and ease sciatica discomfort that can be made worse by sitting for long periods. The sciatic nerve starts in the lower back and runs down both leg, and sciatic nerve pain can occur when the nerve is somehow compressed. Long commutes and sitting for long periods of time exacerbates it.
- **Trikonasana Yoga (Triangle Pose):** This trikonasana yoga stretches and strengthens the muscles along with improving the functions of our body. This is a good yoga exercise for pregnant women. It helps in reducing blood pressure, stress and anxiety and also improves the functions of the blood through the entire body. This yogasana improves our balance & concentration power. It also removes fats from waist and thighs.
- **Tadasana Yoga (Mountain Pose):** Tadasana is also known as mountain pose and it is one of the best yoga asanas. Practicing this yogasana regularly every morning gives a good massage to our hands, back, spine and the whole body. This is the most recommended asana for increasing height as well.
- **Dhanurasana Yoga (Bow Pose):** Dhanurasana is very effective in weight loss program. this yoga pose helps in reducing the belly fat very easily. It streng maskara is considered to be two sets of the twelve asana, with a change in the second set where the opposing leg is moved first. It improves flexibility, strength, balance, reduces stress and anxiety, reduces symptoms of lower back pain, shortens labor and improves birth outcomes, and reduces sleep disturbances and hypertension. It also increases energy and decreases fatigue and are very beneficial for asthma & chronic diseases. This is basic yogasana set to stretch your legs and reduce weight.
- **Surya Namaskar:** This asana is a compilation of 12 asanas packed in two sets and is considered to be one of the best pranayamas. The reason is its aids chronic diseases, hypertension, anxiety, stress and lower back pain. It provides flexibility and enhances energy. If you are looking forward to a weight loss, this can work wonders.
- **Bhujangasana:** If you want to [lose weight](#) then this pose is the best. Also known as cobra pose, this reduces fat from tummy, shoulders, chest and related areas. It increases metabolism and facilitates proper functioning of pancreas, liver, gallbladder and stomach. This among all Yoga Asanas improves blood circulation, strengthens spinal cord, headache and eliminated kidney problems.
- **Vajrasana:** Looking for a simple yet powerful asana then go for Vajrasana that can be performed before or after meals. Also known as Diamond pose this asana helps indigestion, acidity issues, and constipation. It is also good for joint and back pains, relieves stress and brings the mind back to stability.

To experience the benefits of meditation, regular practice is necessary. It takes only a few minutes every day. Once imbibed into the daily routine, meditation becomes the best part of your day! Meditation is like a seed. When you cultivate a seed with love, the more it blossoms. Busy people from all backgrounds are grateful to pause and enjoy a refreshing few minutes of meditation each day. Dive deep into yourself and enrich your life.



The audience comprised of BBA, B.TECH, BCA and BCOM(H) as it was open for students of all courses who have a knack for economics. The 4 members- Anmol Singh, Naman Arora, Atishay and Kartik Sachdev, who are a philomath for world economy, investment and finance, stood as the panelists and conducted their in-depth research on the topic. Aadra Jain, the moderator had come prepared with grilling questions to which the panelists answered with accuracy and sheer spontaneity. The session as planned, was thoroughly interactive and one could find the audience attached with the panel.



As the question-answers began, while asking the audience about the difference between “recession” and “crisis”. Dr. Vijay Dahiya, then, enlightened the students the how’s and why’s about India remaining untouched by the dooming situation of the economic crisis in 2008. Since India has a highly regulated conservative financial system which did not allow banks taking deposits to enter into speculative activities and buy mortgaged back securities which was done by banks throughout the world. Also, leverage ratios of banks were as high as 33:1 in the US while in India they were much under control.

The Panel explained how the advertising of "Lick your candy now and pay for it later" scheme resulted in the collapse. Unfortunately, since no one was there to warn about the tummy aches that would follow to those with a sweet tooth for have-it-now investments in subprime mortgage market. A plunge in the volumes of exchanges could be seen as of the second half of 2008 which was measured by currency devaluation, [equity market](#) decline, and the rise in [sovereign bond](#) spreads, picturing financial devastation emergence. Since these three indicators show financial weakness, taken together, they captured the impact of the crisis. The [International Economics Bulletin](#) reported that [Ukraine](#), as well as [Argentina](#) and [Jamaica](#), are the countries

which were most deeply affected by the crisis along with countries are [Ireland](#), [Russia](#), [Mexico](#), [Hungary](#), the [Baltic states](#), [United States](#) and United Kingdom.

The panelists strung together all the characters of Subprime scam which was the major culprit of whole recession, prime and subprime buyers, brokers and investment bankers, the investment banks, credit banks and so on, for which they called up few volunteers to demonstrate and narrate the complete story. This was surely a good take by the students of Arthaniti as a spontaneous improvisation.

The session as planned, was thoroughly interactive and one could find the audience attached with the panel. Which converted into a successful turnout of over 70+ students in their orientation cum interviews. The panel discussion ended up with a 20 minutes long Q&A round and showering of claps.

### 9. Activity: Johari Window


Dated 29<sup>th</sup> August , 5<sup>th</sup> September, 2019



level of our Indian economy and how much the India is in need of more job creators than seekers. Students participated enthusiastically presenting their point of view by giving their best shot.


